

## **IBPS RRB Exam Guide**

## **Eligibility**:

Post	Educational Qualification	Experience
Office Assistant (Multipurpose)	Degree in any discipline from a recognized University or its equivalent(a) Essential: Proficiency in local language (b) Desirable: Knowledge of Computer skills.

Officer Scale-II(General Banking Officer)	Degree in any discipline from a recognized University or its equivalent with a minimum of 50% marks in aggregate.	Two years as an officer in a Bank or Financial Institution.
Officer Scale-III	Degree in any discipline from a recognized University or its equivalent with a minimum of 50% marks in aggregate.	Minimum 5 years experience as an Officer in a Bank or Financial Institutions

Language Proficiency\*: The candidates for Officer Scale I and Office Assistants (Multipurpose) are required to possess proficiency in the local language of the State / UT for which vacancies he / she wishes to apply, to be eligible as per the notification of the concerned RRB as may be specified by the Board of the RRB. (The condition does not apply for the posts of Officer Scale II and III) For ensuring proficiency in local language, the candidate should have passed 10<sup>th</sup> standard exam with local language as a subject. Age Limit: (a) For Officer Scale-III: Above 21 years – Below 40 years (b) For Officer Scale-II: Above 21 years – Below 32 years (c) For Officer Scale-I: Above 18 years – Below 28 years (d) For Office Assistant (Multipurpose): Between 18 years and 28 years Scheme of IBPS RRB



Exam: Online Examination of 200 Marks having objective questions on five sections such as Maths(Numerical Ability), English, Reasoning, General Awareness and Computer Knowledge.Penalty for Wrong Answers: There will be penalty for wrong answers marked in the Objective Tests. For each question for which a wrong answer has been given by the candidate one fourth or 0.25 of the marks assigned to that question will be deducted as penalty to arrive at corrected score. If a question is left blank, i.e. no answer is marked by the candidate; there will be no penalty for that question. Standardized Scores: (i) The corrected scores obtained by each of the candidates in different sessions (if held) will first be normalized using equipercentile method. (ii) Normalized scores may subsequently be standardized by linear conversion method. (iii) If the standard score obtained is in fraction, the marks obtained will be rounded off to the nearest integer, i.e. if fraction is 0.50 or more, it will be rounded off to next higher integer. Cut-off Score: Each candidate will have to secure a minimum standard score in each of the tests and also on the Total Weighted Standard Score. The cut-off points to qualify in each of the tests will be decided based on the average (Average – 1/4 Standard Deviation for General category candidates and Average – 3/4 Standard Deviation for Reserved Category candidates). CWE Score: The candidates' scores will be made available on IBPS website and candidates may view the same using their credentials like registration no., roll no., password etc. Validity of IBPS RRB CWE Score: Score issued by IBPS will be valid for one year from the date of display of the Score on IBPS's website and will be considered for recruitment exercises during that period. Allotment: It should be noted that IBPS is a test conducting agency. The ultimate recruitment will be done by each participating RRB who will independently issue a separate recruitment notification, specifying vacancies and stipulating the eligibility criteria, as desired by respective RRBs. Recruitment is subject to vacancies of individual RRBs, where IBPS has no role to play.
