

Cheetah: Cheetah is also the world's fastest, land mammal which is found in Africa and Asia. It is one of the oldest species, whose ancestors can be traced back to the Miocene epoch more than five million years ago. Their skin is slightly brown and golden, which is thicker than that of Asiatic cheetahs. They have a lot more spots and lines on their face than the Asian species.

Scientific name of African cheetah: *Acinonyx jubatus*.

- ◆ Asiatic Cheetah Scientific name: *Acinonyx jubatus veneticus*.
- ◆ Large body fur, short head and long neck, usually red eyes and often a cat-like appearance. It is smaller than the African cheetah. They are found only in Iran and there are less than 100 left in their numbers.

Important Points

- ◆ Human-wildlife conflict, loss of habitat and non-availability of prey and illegal trafficking. Forest lands and cheetah habitats have decreased due to deforestation and agriculture. Climate change and increasing human population have further complicated these problems.
- ◆ Kuno National Park: Kuno National Park is a protected area in the state of Madhya Pradesh, India, which was given the status of a national park in 2018. It was established in 1981 as a wild sanctuary. or Sheopur and Morena districts of the state.
- ◆ Conservation Efforts by India: Seven years ago, the Wildlife Institute of India prepared a rehabilitation project for Cheetah conservation at a cost of Rs 260 crore. This could be the world's first inter-continental cheetah relocation project. The Environment Ministry had released the 'Action Plan for Cheetah Return to India' at the 19th meeting of the National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA). The National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA) has decided to bring 50 African cheetahs from Namibia within the next 5 years.

Environmental benefits of the project:

- ◆ The most obvious advantage from an environmental point of view is the minimum requirement of land which is mostly for the associated drainage system.
- ◆ Also with the presence of floating solar panels the evaporation rate from water bodies is reduced, thus helping in water conservation.
- ◆ About 32.5 lakh cubic meters of water can be saved annually by evaporation.
- ◆ The water body beneath the solar modules helps to maintain the temperature of their surroundings, which improves their efficiency and production. Similarly, coal consumption of 165,000 tonnes per annum can be avoided; Due to which the emission of 2,10,000 tonnes of CO₂ can be avoided annually.

As decided, 'Agniveers' will be provided by a good pay package and an exit retirement package after 4 years of service. It is to notice that, this opportunity is only for personnel below officer ranks that is for those who do not join the forces as commissioned officers. Lt Gen Anil Puri, Additional Secretary, Department of Military Affairs, has said, "Today average age is around 32 yrs, in time to come it'll further come down to 26 years. This will happen in 6-7 years. In order to transform armed

forces into youthful, tech-savvy, modern, there's a need to harness the youth potential and make him a future-ready soldier?" He mentioned that after four years of service with the Army, resume and biodata of agniveers will be very unique and he will stand out in crowd with his attitude, skills and time.

Purpose of Agneepath Scheme 2022 :

- ◆ The main purpose of central government is to introduce the Indian Army Agneepath Entry Scheme with the aim of training the youth and to make a cut in retirement as well as in pensions. Indian government has come up with this scheme in order to strengthen our security forces. Selected candidates will be trained professionally and then they will be recruited within the areas like Jammu and Kashmir border.
- ◆ One of the most important thing to focus about this recruitment is that, there will be no entrance test for the youth. After getting selection, the candidates will go through training for six months and then will be inducted for three and a half years. in order to make them ready for joining armed forces as professionals.
- ◆ Defence minister, Rajnath Singh has said, "This will also lead to availability of a higher-skilled workforce to the economy which will be helpful in productivity gain and overall GDP growth,".

Odisha, 'Mo Bus' Service received the prestigious UN Public Service Award

Mo Bus, Odisha-based public transport service has been honored with a prestigious United Nations award, for their role and efforts in helping the world recover better from Covid19. The public transport service has been recognised for its role in "promoting gender-responsive public services to achieve the SDGs (Sustainable Development Goals)", the UN said. Among the other winners of this year's awards, announced by Liu

service initiatives from Thailand, Brazil, Canada, Ireland, Panama, the Philippines, Poland, Saudi Arabia, and Ukraine.

Recognition for Odisha:

- ◆ The UN recognition said the “problem” was that “bus services in the city of Bhubaneswar needed improvement”, as a result of which “the majority of people used private vehicles, two-wheelers and auto-rickshaw to commute instead of taking public transportation”.
- ◆ As the “solution”, the Odisha government in 2018 “reorganized the public transit services in the city to provide an integrated, reliable and inclusive public bus service system”. Mo Bus, the UN noted, has incorporated “real-time technologies like live tracking, travel planner and e-ticketing”, and an e-rickshaw system called ‘Mo E-Ride’ has been introduced as a last-mile feeder service.



Cabinet Approvals on June 8,2022

On June 8,2022 the Union Cabinet chaired by Prime Minister of India Narendra Modi approved the following proposals:

The Union Cabinet has approved the transfer of 10 in-orbit communication satellites from Government of India (GoI) to NewSpace India Ltd. (NSIL), a wholly owned Public Sector Enterprise (PSE) of GOI under the administrative control of the Department of Space.

The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA) chaired by the PM Narendra Modi, has approved the increase in the Minimum Support Prices (MSP) for all mandated Kharif Crops for Marketing Season 2022-23 to ensure remunerative prices to the growers for their produce and encourage crop diversification.

Cabinet Approvals with Foreign Countries on June 8,2022

The Union Cabinet chaired by Prime Minister (PM) Narendra Modi approved the following proposals with foreign countries which were briefed by Union Minister Anurag Singh Thakur, Ministry of Information & Broadcasting (MIB) during a media briefing on Cabinet decisions, at National Media Centre in New Delhi, Delhi.

Cabinet has approved the proposal for signing a bilateral Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between India and the United Arab Emirates (UAE) on Cooperation in the field of Industries and Advanced Technologies.

The Union Cabinet has approved the signing of MoU to establish collaborative guidelines between the National Institute for Environmental Studies (NIES), Japan and Aryabhata Research Institute of Observational Sciences (ARIES), India to carry out and implement joint research on air quality and climate change.

The Union Cabinet also approved the signing of MoU between S. N. Bose National Centre for Basic Sciences (SNBNCBS), Kolkata (West Bengal), India and Leibniz-Institut fur Festkorper- und Werkstofforschung Dresden e.V. (IFW Dresden e.V.), Dresden, Germany for scientific cooperation in the field of Novel Magnetic and Topological Quantum Materials.

The Union Cabinet approved the MoU between MoHUA, Government of India and Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT), Government of Australia for Technical Cooperation for Australia-India Water Security Initiative (AIWASI).

The Union Cabinet also approved the signing of MoU among DBT, ICMR, and International AIDS Vaccine Initiative (IAVI), US in health sector.

Govt Launches PMMSY dashboard; Investment of around Rs 7,243 cr done

On 9th June 2022 Union Minister of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying Parshottam Rupala launched a Management Information System (MIS) dashboard for Padhan Mantri Matsya Samapada Yojana (PMMSY) for aggregating information on one platform.

- ◆ The project investment of Rs 7,242.90 crore has been made in the Financial Years 2020 to 2022 (FY20-22) under PMMSY.

Hyper-Sensitive Airports to Install PIDS By 2023; Indigo & American Airlines Launches Codeshare Agreement

As per the circular provided by The Bureau of Civil Aviation Security (BCAS), all 'hyper-sensitive' airports need to install a perimeter intrusion detection system (PIDS) by December 2023, which helps in alerting security agencies of any intrusion through the boundary walls of the airport.

- ◆ Greenfield airports that are not part of the government's Regional Connectivity Scheme (RCS) will also install PIDS.
- ◆ The airports coming up under RCS will plan the installation of PIDS at the development stage itself for the purpose of obtaining clearance of design stage security.
- ◆ Further, non-RCS greenfield airports shall plan installation of PIDS at design stage itself for the purpose of obtaining clearance of design stage security vetting in terms of rule 5 (3) of the Aircraft (Security) Rules 2011.

Indigo & American Airlines Launches Codeshare Agreement

IndiGo and American Airlines have launched a codeshare agreement that allows American Airlines to sell seats on the IndiGo's flights operating on Delhi-Bengaluru and Delhi-Mumbai routes.

Highlights :

- ◆ **American Airlines** : Currently, American Airlines operates flights on the New York-Delhi route only.
- ◆ The plan to extend the codeshare agreement in the near future includes more destinations in India, in addition to Bengaluru and Mumbai.
- ◆ **IndiGo** : IndiGo is India's largest airline that already has codeshare agreements with Qatar Airways, Turkish Airlines and Air France-KLM airlines.

Union Finance & Corporate Affairs Minister Nirmala Sitharaman Launches EASE 5.0 Public Sector Banks Common Reforms Agenda

On June 8, 2022, Union Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, Ministry of Finance (MoF) & Ministry of Corporate Affairs (MoCA) unveiled the fifth edition of Enhanced Access and Service Excellence - 'EASE 5.0: Enhanced digital experience; data-driven, integrated, and inclusive banking', which provides the Common Public Sector Banks (PSBs) Reforms Agenda for fiscal year 2022-23 (FY23) under the EASENext program.

Need For Such Reforms: Since all PSBs are now profitable and have stronger balance sheets, it has become essential for them to harness this advantage to further boost their competitiveness.

ICAR-NRCE Develops "Anocovax" India's 1st COVID-19 Vaccine for Animals

Narendra Singh Tomar, Union Minister, Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare (MoAFW) launched "Anocovax", India's first indigenously developed COVID-19 vaccine for animals. The vaccine developed by the Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR)- National Research Centre on Equines (NRCE) (Hisar, Haryana), is safe for dogs, lions, leopards, mice and rabbits.

- ◆ Anocovax contains inactivated SARS-CoV-2 Delta (COVID-19) antigen with Alhydrogel as an adjuvant.
- ◆ This neutralises both Delta and Omicron variants of the SARS-CoV-2.

TDB under DST to Launch RS 1000 Crore Startup Funder under PPP Model

The Technology Development Board (TDB), a statutory body under the Department of Science and Technology (DST), Ministry of Science and Technology is set to launch a Rs 1000 crore fund under a Public-Private Partnership (PPP) model.

i. Objective of the fund is to invest in startups across several sectors. The fund will also invest in early-stage startups.

The fund will be launched in 2 phases

India Extends Sri Lanka USD 55 Million Credit Line for Fertiliser Imports

On 10th June 2022 A Line of Credit (LoC) agreement has been signed between the Government of Sri Lanka (GOSL) and the Export-Import (EXIM) Bank of India at Colombo, Sri Lanka to extend a Line of Credit (LOC) of USD 55 million to Sri Lanka for the procurement of Urea Fertiliser.

- ◆ The LoC agreement was signed in the presence of the Prime Minister of Sri Lanka Ranil Wickremesinghe, the Minister of Agriculture Mahinda Amaraweera, and the High Commissioner of India to Sri Lanka Gopal Baglay.
- ◆ This credit line was extended in response to an urgent request from GOSL against the ongoing economic crisis.

PM Modi inaugurates IN-SPACe



Recently Prime Minister Narendra Modi established the Indian National Center for Space Promotion and Authorization (IN-SPACe) in Ahmedabad and reviewed its headquarters. Union Home Minister Amit Shah was also present in this program. PM also inaugurated AM Naik Healthcare Complex and Nirali Multi-Specialty Hospital in Navsari. During this, the Prime

Minister also met his high school teacher in Vadnagar, Navsari. Prime Minister Modi laid the foundation stone for several development projects totaling Rs 3,050 crore to improve the water supply of the region as well as increase connections and make life easier.

FSSAI's 4th State Food Security Index

Recently the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare has released the fourth State Food Safety Index (SFSI) led by the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) on the occasion of World Food Safety Day. The State Food Security Index was launched in 2018-19 to bring about a competitive and positive change in the food security ecosystem of the country. This index was developed by FSSAI to measure the performance of states on several parameters of food security.

Important points:

- ◆ It is the fourth state food security index released to measure the performance of states on five parameters of food security.
- ◆ In this, Tamil Nadu has secured the first position in the category of large states.
- ◆ Goa has secured the first position in the small states category, followed by Manipur and Sikkim.
- ◆ In the Union Territories category, Jammu and Kashmir, Delhi and Chandigarh occupy the top three positions respectively.

UDAN celebrates 2022 as its 5th Anniversary Year

Central Government scheme of Ude Desh Ka Aam Naagrik (UDAN) i.e. let the

country's typical person fly, is celebrating its fifth anniversary this year. This first of its kind scheme, headed by the Ministry of Civil Aviation (MoCA), stimulates Regional Connectivity Scheme (RCS) through a market-based mechanism.

It ensures common man to commute between smaller cities in a short time, and at an affordable cost.

The Airports Authority of India (AAI) is its implementing agency.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi Launches Several Development Projects in Gujarat

On June 10, 2022, Prime Minister (PM) Narendra Modi inaugurated and laid the foundation stone of various development projects worth Rs 3,050 crores during the 'Gujarat Gaurav Abhiyan' at Khudvel, a tribal region in Navsari district of Gujarat.

- ◆ This comprises the inauguration of seven projects, the laying of foundation stones for 12 projects, and the Bhumi Pujan of 14 projects.
- ◆ The projects will aid in improving the region's water supply, as well as enhance connectivity and improve ease of living for Gujarat's residents. PM Narendra Modi has inaugurated the headquarters of the Indian National Space Promotion and Authorisation Centre (IN-SPACe) at Bopal in Ahmedabad, Gujarat. He was accompanied by Union Home Minister Amit Shah to the ceremony.

Defence Ministry Amends Service Rule: Retired Chiefs of Tri Service Eligible for the Post of CDS

The Ministry of Defence has amended the service rule of the Army, Air Force and Navy, inserting the clause allowing the retired Chief

and their second in command in the armed forces, not older than 62, eligible for the post of Chief of Defence Staff (CDS), the topmost military assignment.

The government may extend the service of the CDS for such a period as it may deem necessary subject to a maximum age of 65 years.

The clause has been inserted after sub-rule (4) of rule 16A of the Army Rules, 1954

- ◆ This will enable the retired 3 star generals from Army, Navy and Air force to become eligible for the post of CDS.
- ◆ The post of CDS has been vacant since the death of General Bipin Rawat in a helicopter crash on 8th December 2021 in Coonoor, Nilgiris, Tamil Nadu.

Conclave on 'Direct to Mobile and 5 G Broadband - Convergence Roadmap for India'; D2M Technology

Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Kanpur, Uttar Pradesh(UP) in collaboration with Telecommunications Standards Development Society, India (TSDSI) organised a conclave on 'Direct to Mobile and 5 G Broadband - Convergence Roadmap for India' at Akashvani Rang Bhawan auditorium of Prasar Bharati in New Delhi, Delhi.

The 1st time NextGen Broadcast technology on smart phones and other smart devices were demonstrated and joint white paper on Direct-to-Mobile (D2M) broadcasting by IIT Kanpur, TSDSI and Prasar Bharat, India's public broadcaster, was released.

Govt Launches Rashtriya Puraskar Portal; Invites Nominees for Various Awards

The Union Government has launched a common portal, the Rashtriya Puraskar Portal (<https://awards.gov.in>) for inviting nominations for national awards of the various Ministries, Departments and agencies.

- ◆ **Aim** : To facilitate citizens to nominate individuals and organisations for various national awards under one platform, instituted by the Government of India.
- ◆ With this portal, for the first time in the history of India, information regarding all national awards would be available to the public on a single digital platform including their eligibility criteria, selection procedure, and details of past awardees.
- ◆ Also, people will be able to make nominations for various awards on a single platform, which is simple and user-friendly.

MoR Launches Indian Railway Innovation Policy - StartUps for Railways



On 13th June 2022 the Minister of Railways, Communications and Electronics & Information Technology Ashwini Vaishnav launched Indian Railway Innovation Policy - 'StartUps for Railways' and also an 'Indian Railway Innovation Portal' in Rail Bhavan, New Delhi.

- ◆ Aim : To leverage innovative technologies developed by Indian Startups / MSMEs / Innovators / Entrepreneurs to improve operational efficiency and Safety of Indian Railways
- ◆ Problems like rail fracture, headway reduction etc. have been taken up for phase 1 of this program which will be presented before the start ups to find innovative solutions.

Union Civil Aviation Minister Jyotiraditya M. Scindia Launches National Aero Sports Policy 2022

The National Air Sports Policy 2022 (NASP 2022). was launched by Union Minister Jyotiraditya M. Scindia, Ministry of Civil Aviation (MoCA), with the aim of optimizing India's potential in the field of air sports.

By 2030, the NASP 2022 aims to make India one of the top sports nations in the world by providing a safe, affordable, accessible, enjoyable, and sustainable air sports ecosystem.

The NASP 2022 is a first step toward realising India's potential in the field of aviation.

It is drafted with inputs from policymakers, practitioners, and the general public in mind, and it ensures the establishment of high-quality infrastructure, equipment, instructors, and services.

Union Minister Dr Jitendra Singh Releases 2nd edition of NeSDA 2021

Dr Jitendra Singh, Union Minister of State(MoS) Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances & Pensions released the 2 nd edition "National e-Governance Service Delivery

Assessment 2021 (NeSDA 2021): Reaching citizens through seamless service delivery"_repared by the Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances (DARPG) under the Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances \& Pensions.

- ◆ NeSDA is a biennial study that provides suggestions for the government to enhance its e-governance service delivery system.

Cabinet Committee on Security Approved New Scheme 'Agnipath' for Soldier Recruitment

Cabinet Committee on Security has approved the new scheme called "Agneepath" (Agnipath) for recruitment of soldiers in the Army, Navy and Air Force. This aims to reduce the increasing salary and pensions. This is a transformative initiative which will provide a youthful profile to the Indian Armed Forces.

- ◆ At present, the average age in the force is 32 years, this will be reduced to 26 in 6 to 7 years.
- ◆ The scheme was initially named as "Tour of Duty", was launched in the presence of the chiefs of all the three services.

PM Narendra Modi Inaugurated Iconic Week Celebrations of FinMin & MCA-June 6-12, 2022

As a part of the 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav (AKAM)', an Iconic Week Celebrations of the Ministry of Finance and Ministry of Corporate Affairs (MCA) were held from June \$6-12,2022\$, at Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi, Delhi. It was inaugurated by Prime Minister (PM) of India Narendra Modi.The event held under the theme of "Transforming Lives".

The PM Narendra Modi launched Jan Samarth Portal, a first of its kind platform to directly connect beneficiaries to lenders. It provides single window facility for 13 Government Schemes application submission and \$125+ \$ Member Lending Institutions-MLIs (including all Public Sector Banks) to choose from.

The PM also launched a special series of coins of Re 1, 2, 5, 10 and 20 denominations having AKAM design. They are not commemorative coins and will be part of circulation.

The Union Finance Minister also launched NETRA (New e-Tracking and Remote Administration) portal, and Mobile Application for Indian Development and Economic Assistance Scheme (IDEAS).

On June 8, 2022, Indian Customs under the Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs (CBIC) observed 'Drug Destruction Day' across India as a part of AKAM during which \$42054.104\$ kgs kilograms of narcotics were destroyed which includes 17,108,45 tablets, 72757 bottles of cough syrup, and 16,336 vials of injections.

Indian Navy Conducts 38th Coordinated Patrol with Indonesian Navy

On 13th June 2022, the 38th India-Indonesia Coordinated Patrol (IND-INDO CORPAT) between the Indian Navy (IN) Units of Andaman & Nicobar Command (ANC) and Indonesian Navy have been started in the Andaman Sea and Straits of Malacca which takes place till 24th June 2022.

- ◆ The 38th CORPAT is the first post pandemic Coordinated Patrol (CORPAT) between India and Indonesia.

Modi Inaugurates Biotech Startup Expo - 2022 in New Delhi; Launched Biotech products & e-Portal

On 9th June 2022, Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the Biotech Startup Expo - 2022 at Pragati Maidan, New Delhi, Delhi. Biotech Startup Expo - 2022 is a 2-day event held on 9th & 10th June 2022, organised by the Department of Biotechnology and Biotechnology Industry Research Assistance Council (BIRAC).

- ◆ The expo is a part of the celebration of the completion of 10 years of the establishment of BIRAC. The celebration recognises the efforts of BIRAC toward the biotech sector of India.
- ◆ The theme of Biotech Startup Expo - 2022 is "Biotech Startup Innovations: Towards AatmaNirbhar Bharat".

Russia Overtakes Saudi Arabia to Become India's 2nd Biggest Oil Supplier

Russia has overtaken Saudi Arabia to become India's 2nd-biggest oil supplier next to Iraq, as Russian crude is currently available at discount following the war in Ukraine.

- ◆ Indian refiners have bought Russian crude oil at discount as high as USD 30 per barrel.
- ◆ Iraq was the top supplier to India and Saudi Arabia stands 3rd biggest supplier to India.
- ◆ **Note** : India is the world's 3rd biggest oil-importing and consuming nation after the United States (US) and China.

The Union Cabinet has approved the signing of cooperation in the field of youth work among the member countries of the SCO

The Union Cabinet approved the signing of cooperation in the field of youth work among the member countries of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization-SCO. The MoU for cooperation in the field of youth work was signed by the Minister of Youth Affairs and Sports on 17 September last year with the member countries. The official working languages of the SCO Secretariat are Russian and Chinese. The aim of the agreement is to strengthen mutual trust, friendly relations and cooperation among the youth of SCO member countries. This agreement will ensure the development of youth cooperation to enhance the friendly relations among the SCO member states. The conditions for youth cooperation will be further improved based on international experience.

APEDA organizes eight-day mango festival in Bahrain



The Agricultural and Processed Food Products Export Development Authority (APEDA) has organized an eight-day mango festival in Bahrain to promote mango exports. The Ministry of Commerce and Industry said that 34 varieties of mangoes from the states of West

Bengal, Bihar, Jharkhand, Uttar Pradesh and Odisha have been displayed at eight different places in Bahrain. All these varieties of mangoes have been procured directly from farmers and two agricultural producer organisations. This mango exhibition will run till 20th of this month. The Ministry said that the Mango Festival is part of APEDA's new initiative to explore the international market potential for Indian mangoes in Bahrain under 2022

Approval of the proposal to sign an agreement between India and the United Nations to develop a "Way Finding Application"

The Union Cabinet has approved the proposal to sign an agreement between India and the United Nations to develop a Way Finding Application to be used at the United Nations Office in Geneva. The project for the development of Way Finding Applications was conceptualized in the year 2020 to mark the 75th anniversary of the United Nations. The development and maintenance of this app is estimated to cost \$2 million. A large number of delegates arrive at the United Nations Office in five buildings and 21 floors to attend various meetings and conferences. The Way Finding App will help the visitors to find the route inside the campus. This GPS based app will be helpful in locating the rooms and offices.

Kerala CM inaugurates Cancer Research Center in Kochi

The Chief Minister of Kerala, Pinarayi Vijayan has inaugurated a Cancer Diagnostic and Research Center here, which is the country's first

oncology laboratory for comprehensive cancer diagnosis services. Carinos Healthcare's Advanced Center for Cancer Diagnosis and Research will serve as a central laboratory for analyzing samples at the molecular and genomic levels to aid in personalized targeted therapy, predict potential response to treatment and by liquid biopsy. Will evaluate the response.

First Bharat Pride train starts from Coimbatore-North to Sai Nagar Shirdi

The first Bharat Pride train started from Coimbatore North for Sai Nagar Shirdi. It was flagged off by the Divisional Manager, Southern Rail Salem, Gautam Srinivas. Southern Railway's release states that this train is being operated by a private service provider. In the first journey of this train, one thousand one hundred passengers traveled from Coimbatore to Shirdi. South Star Rail is a registered service provider company operating trains on this route. Three crore thirty four lakh rupees per year will get a fixed revenue from the operation of this train. The theme-based Bharat Gaurav train aims to showcase the rich cultural heritage and best historical places of the country.

Anand Gopal Mahindra, Venu Srinivasan, Ramanbhai Patel and Ravindra Dholakia nominated to the Central Board of RBI

The Central Government has nominated Mahindra Group Chairman Anand Gopal Mahindra, TVS Motors Chairman Venu Srinivasan, Zydu Group Chairman Ramanbhai Patel and former Indian Institute of Management, Ahmedabad Ravindra Dholakia as Central Part-time Directors on the Reserve Bank

of India as Central Non-Efficient Board of Directors. . In the release, the central bank has said that these people will be appointed for a period of four years from June 14. The Central Government appoints 10 non-official directors to the Board of the Reserve Bank from time to time. The official and whole-time board of directors of the bank consists of four deputy governors including the governor.

First National Conference of Chief Secretaries begins in Dharamsala, Himachal Pradesh

The first three-day National Conference of Chief Secretaries of the States began in Dharamsala, Himachal Pradesh. Cabinet Secretary Rajiv Gauba inaugurated the conference. Prime Minister Narendra Modi will preside over the conference, which will continue till Friday. More than 200 delegates from the Centre, States, Union Territories and experts will participate in the conference. In this, the implementation of new education policy, governance and crop diversification and self-sufficiency in agriculture will be discussed. The focus will be on rapid and sustainable economic growth in partnership with the Center and the States.

India's 1st Government MLD Desalination Plant for Industrial Use inaugurated in Dahej, Gujarat

On June 16,2022 , India's first government desalination plant only for industrial use was inaugurated at Dahej in Bharuch (Gujarat) by the Chief Minister (CM) of Gujarat, Bhupendra Patel. It was set up with an outlay of 881.91 crore.

Developers :

- ◆ Its construction work was awarded to the joint venture company of Larsen & Toubro and Tecton.
- ◆ A special purpose vehicle (SPV), Dahej Desal Foundation, has been constituted by the Gujarat Industrial Development Corporation (GIDC), and the beneficiary industrial units for operation and maintenance of the plant.

Gol Reconstitutes Committee to Examine the Representation of Officials Sacked for Alleged Corruption

The three-member panel of the committee to examine the representation of officials sacked for alleged inefficiency or corruption in the government service has been reconstituted by the Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions of the Government of India (Gol).

Members of the Panel :

- ◆ Arti Ahuja, Secretary, Department of Chemicals and Petrochemicals, Ministry of Chemicals and Fertilizers, has been appointed in place of Leena Nandan, Secretary, Ministry of Environment, Forest, and Climate Change.
- ◆ Puneet Kansal, Joint Secretary in the Cabinet Secretariat, has been appointed in place of Ashutosh Jindal, Additional Secretary in the Cabinet Secretariat.
- ◆ One member of the panel will be nominated by the cadre controlling authority (under whose administrative control the alleged corrupt officials come).

Indian Navy & NCMRWF Inks MoU for Cooperation on Numerical Model-Based Applications in Meteorology and Oceanology

The Indian Navy and the National Centre for Medium Range Weather Forecasting (NCMRWF) of the Ministry of Earth Sciences (MoES), signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for "Cooperation on Numerical Model-Based Applications in Meteorology and Oceanology."

The MoU was signed during a ceremony at NCMRWF in Noida, Uttar Pradesh, by Dr. Ashis K. Mitra, Head of NCMRWF, and Commodore G. Rambabu, Head of the Indian Navy's Directorate of Naval Oceanology and Meteorology (DNOM), Integrated Headquarters, Ministry of Defence (Navy).

Significance :

- ◆ Under this collaboration, the Indian Navy and NCMRWF will share expertise in the domains of weather and ocean modelling, coupled modelling, data assimilation, ensemble forecasting, and satellite data utilisation, with the intent of keeping both organisations up to date with rapid development.
- ◆ This would also promote meaningful interactions that leverage on the professional strengths of both organisations.

Delhi airport introduces RFID-enabled tag to track check-in luggage

In a first in India, the Indira Gandhi International Airport in Delhi introduced radiofrequency identification (RFID) enabled baggage tags which will give passengers real-

time information about the location of their luggage. The RFID technology will be personalised and help arriving passengers keep track of their check-in luggage. The bag tags will be called 'Bagg Trax', and It will not only help domestic and international arrival passengers but also those in transit to track their checked-in baggage.

The tag is a blue-yellow card with a QR code on it. To avail the facility, the passenger will have to register by scanning the QR code or visit "bag.hoi.in" on their phones. After this, they will receive a message confirming the registration of the tag. Flyers will receive real-time SMS alerts with details of baggage on their phone.

WPI inflation rises to Record High of 15.88 % in May 2022: NSO Data

In accordance with the data released by the National Statistical Office (NSO), Ministry of Commerce and Industry (MoCI), the Wholesale Price Index (WPI) inflation rose to a record high of 15.88 % in May 2022 from 15.08 % in April 2022.

- ◆ This is the highest WPI in the 2011-12 series.
- ◆ The WPI based inflation was 13.11 % in May 2021.

Reason behind this rise :

- ◆ The high rate of inflation in May, 2022 is primarily due to rise in prices of vegetables, fruits, milk, manufacturing, fuel, power, mineral oils, crude petroleum & natural gas, basic metals, chemicals & chemical products and food products etc.

Shreyas G. Hosur becomes the first Indian Railways officer to complete the gruelling 'Ironman' Triathlon



Shreyas G. Hosur became the first officer from the Indian Railways to complete the gruelling 'Ironman' Triathlon, considered to be the toughest single-day sports event in the world. This event includes 3.8 km swimming, 180 km of cycling and 42.2 km of running.

- ◆ Shreyas G. Hosur also became first officer from the non-uniformed Civil Services to complete the event. He completed the event in 13 hours and 26 minutes in Hamburg, Germany.
- ◆ Shreyas G. Hosur, is an Indian Railway Accounts Service (IRAS) officer of the 2012 Batch. He is returned from deputation to National Technical Research Organization (NTRO), Delhi and he is currently serving as Dy. FA&CAO in Construction/SWR.

Rubber Board's electronic trading platform 'mRube' goes live

India hosted ASEAN Foreign Ministers & Secretary General for a Special ASEAN-India Foreign Ministers' Meeting (SAIFMM) 2022

- ◆ The Scheme has been revamped as Swadesh Darshan \$2.0\$ with aims to undertake holistic development with the vision to develop Sustainable and Responsible Tourist Destinations. This will promote the adoption of principles of sustainable tourism including environmental, socio-cultural and economic sustainability.

GE Steam Power Signs USD 165 Million Pact with BHEL To Supply Three Nuclear Steam Turbines

GE Steam Power, a world energy leader, has inked a USD 165 million pact with state-run engineering firm Bharat Heavy Electricals Limited (BHEL) to supply three nuclear steam turbines.

The pact is for the supply of three nuclear steam turbines out of six units for Nuclear Power Corporation of India Limited (NPCIL) domestic nuclear program phase 1 being developed at Gorakhpur in Haryana (units - 1 to 4 [Gorakhpur Haryana Anu Vidyut Pariyojana (GHAVP)] and Kaiga in Karnataka (Kaiga Generating Station-5&6).

- ◆ Domestic Program of Nuclear Power Corporation of India Limited (NPCIL) NPCIL's domestic programme comprises the development of 12 units of 700 Mwe (Megawatts electric) nuclear reactors using their own nuclear reactor technology, i.e., Pressurized Heavy Water Reactors (PHWR).
- ◆ In total, it will provide India with 8.4 GW (gigawatts) of Carbon dioxide (CO2) free electricity, enough to power more than 14 million homes.

DoT Launches Design-Linked Incentive Scheme, Extends Telecom PLI by 1 year



- ◆ Objective - To build a strong ecosystem for 5G.


ICG Inducts Indigenous Developed ALH Mk-III in Chennai

The ALH is an indigenous aircraft designed and developed by the Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL).

- ◆ This is the first induction into the newly created '840 Squadron' that is to be based in Chennai, three more choppers of the same variant are to be inducted.
- ◆ The new aircraft was received at the Coast Guard Air Station, Chennai, with a traditional water cannon salute and Inspector General A P Badola, TM, Commander, Coast Guard Region East, welcomed the aircraft and crew..



China releases New Comprehensive Geologic Map of the Moon; World's 'Most Detailed to date' Map of Moon



China has released a new comprehensive geologic map of the moon. This is the world's "most detailed to date" map of the moon. The new map of scale was published by Science Bulletin. This is expected to contribute to scientific research, exploration and landing site selection on the Moon.

- ◆ The map includes 12,341 impact craters, 81 impact basins, 17 rock types and 14 types of structures, which provides abundant information about the geology of the moon and its evolution.
- ◆ This project was led by the Institute of Geochemistry of the Chinese Academy of Sciences along with the Chinese Academy of Geological Science, China University of Geosciences and Shandong University.

- ◆ This high-resolution topographic map was prepared based on the data from Chang'e project, the lunar exploration project of China, and other data and research findings from various international organisations.

Ecuador, Japan, Malta, Mozambique, Switzerland Elected to Serve as Non Permanent Members On UNSC

The United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) elected Ecuador, Japan, Malta, Mozambique, and Switzerland to serve as non-permanent members of the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) for a two-year term beginning January 01, 2023.

- ◆ The newly elected countries will replace India, Ireland, Kenya, Mexico, and Norway, which will vacate their seats at the end of 2022.
- ◆ The UNSC is a United Nations (UN) organisation tasked with maintaining global peace and security.
- ◆ On June 9, 2022, the UNGA held elections to elect the five non-permanent members for the two-year period 2023-24. Abdulla Shahid, the President of the United Nations General Assembly, announced the result.

DAVINCI Mission: NASA's Venus Mission is Set to Launch in 2029

NASA's Venus Mission, Deep Atmosphere Venus Investigation of Noble gases, Chemistry, and Imaging (DAVINCI) mission named after visionary Renaissance artist and scientist Leonardo da Vinci (Italy) is tentatively scheduled to launch in June 2029 and enter the atmosphere of Venus in June 2031.

This will be the 1st mission to Venus that will incorporate science-driven fly-bys and an instrumented descent sphere into a unified architecture.

- ◆ DAVINCI, with Venus Oxygen Fugacity (Vfox), a miniature sensor, will measure the amount of oxygen present near the surface of Venus.
- ◆ VfoX will be designed, fabricated, tested, operated, and analysed by undergraduate and graduate students as the mission's Student Collaboration Experiment.
- ◆ The detail was published in the The Planetary Science Journal.

UNCTAD: India Ranked 7th at the Global Economies for FDI in 2021

According to the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD) World Investment Report 2022 entitled "International tax reforms and sustainable investment", India ranked 7th in the top 10 global economies for Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) in 2021 despite a decline in FDI investment.

- ◆ FDI inflows have declined by USD 19 billion to USD 45 billion in 2021.

- ◆ However India managed to reach the top 10 economies for FDI inflows in 2021, ranking 7th after the US, China, Hong Kong, Singapore, Canada and Brazil.
- ◆ Adding South Africa, Russia and Mexico to the list to round up the top 10 economies for FDI inflows in 2021.

US Treasury Report: India Among 12 Economies On Currency 'Monitoring List'

According to the semiannual Report of the United States (US) Department of the Treasury - "Macroeconomic and Foreign Exchange Policies of Major Trading Partners of the United States" India is one of the 12 major economies that merit close attention to their currency practices and macroeconomic policies.

- ◆ The Monitoring list comprises China, Japan, South Korea, Germany, Italy, India, Malaysia, Singapore, Thailand, Taiwan, Vietnam and Mexico.
- ◆ All these countries, except Taiwan and Vietnam, were on the monitoring list in the report of December 2021.

UNGA adopts India Sponsored Multilingualism Resolution; Mentions Hindi for the 1st Time

On 10th June 2022, the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) adopted a resolution on multilingualism, co-sponsored by India, that mentioned the Hindi language for the first time. The resolution also mentions Bangla and Urdu for the first time.

- ◆ The resolution encourages the United Nations(UN) to continue to spread awareness about the importance of communications and messages in official as well as non-official languages such as Portuguese, Kiswahili, Hindi, Persian, Bangla, and Urdu, in addition to official languages, in order to promote multilingualism. .
- ◆ Arabic, Chinese, English, French, Russian and Spanish are the six official languages of the United Nations; English and French being the working languages of the United Nations Secretariat.
- ◆ India's Permanent Representative to the United Nations is T. S. Tirumurti.

EAM of India S. Jaishankar visits Slovakia & the Czech Republic



Dr Subrahmanyam Jaishankar, External Affairs Minister (EAM) of India visited Slovakia on 2nd-3rd June 2022 and the Czech Republic on 4th-5th June 2022 and held various high-level exchanges and discussions on the cooperation across sectors with the leadership of both the nations.

EAM Visits Slovakia 2nd-3rd June 2022 :

- ◆ EAM Jaishankar met H.E. Mr Ivan Korčok, Minister of Foreign and European Affairs of Slovakia. This is the first-ever visit at the EAM level since the creation of Slovakia in 1993.

Highlights of Visit :

- ◆ On 3rd June 2022, EAM participated in the 17th edition of the Bratislava Forum "GLOBSEC 2022 Bratislava Forum" which took place from 2nd to 4th June 2022 in Bratislava, Slovakia.
- ◆ He addressed the forum on the topic of "Taking Friendship to the Next Level: Allies in the Indo-Pacific Region".
- ◆ EAM also invited Foreign Minister Ivan Korčok to join the International Solar Alliance.
- ◆ They also exchanged views on regional as well as multilateral issues including Ukraine, European Union(EU) and the Indo-Pacific.
- ◆ Both leaders discussed ways to expand our relations across sectors especially in the areas of investment, culture, tourism and renewable energy.

EAM Visits the Czech Republic 4th-5th June 2022:

EAM met H.E. Mr Jan Lipavský, Minister of Foreign Affairs, Government of Czech Republic.

They discussed bilateral relations, including political, economic, defence & security, Science & Technology (S\&T), cultural, and people-to-people ties.

Both sides agreed to work towards an early conclusion of the India-European Union(EU) Free Trade Agreement(FTA).

Both sides discussed about the steady progress in bilateral cooperation, including in trade and defence, and exchanged views on the Indo-Pacific and the repercussions of the Ukraine conflict.

Note:

The bilateral trade between India and the Czech Republic has crossed over USD 2 billion.

China will set up solar power plant in space



Recently, China has presented a plan to start a solar power plant in space to get continuous electricity in the year 2028. Earlier this plan of China was to set up a solar power station of 1 MW capacity in space by the year 2030, however according to the updated plan, China will launch a satellite in the year 2028. This satellite is 400 km away. It will test the wireless power transmission technology from space to the ground from an altitude of 10 km. It will convert solar energy into microwave or laser. Using a laser, energy beams will be directed toward various targets, including moving satellites and fixed locations on Earth. The capacity of this solar power plant will be 10 kW,

China is building a 33-acre test facility in Chongqing's Bishan district for theoretical feasibility of space-based solar power station.

The facility will help develop space transmission technologies as well as study the effect of microwave beams on living organisms on Earth.

WTO's 12th Ministerial Conference held in Geneva, Switzerland; Co-hosted by Kazakhstan



The World Trade Organization's (WTO) 12th Ministerial Conference (MC12) was co-hosted by Switzerland, and Kazakhstan at WTO headquarters in Geneva, Switzerland after a gap of almost five years from June 12-June 16, 2022. It was attended by the Trade ministers of 164 nations.

It was chaired by Timur Suleimenov, Deputy Chief of Staff of Kazakhstan's President.

Kazakhstan was originally scheduled to host MC12 in June 2020 but the conference was postponed due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The WTO members agreed on tackling the food insecurity concerns, curbing harmful fishing subsidies, temporarily waiving intellectual property (IP) obligations concerning COVID-19 vaccines, deals on e-commerce, responding to pandemics and reforming the organisation itself.

Rajnath Singh's 3-day visit to Vietnam - Strengthens Defence Cooperation



Defence Minister Rajnath Singh went on a 3-day official visit to Vietnam from 8th June 2022, at the invitation of Vietnam's Minister of National Defence General Phan Van Giang.

- ◆ The visit marks 50 years of establishment of India-Vietnam Diplomatic relations and 75 years of India's Independence.
- ◆ Vietnam is an important partner in India's Act East policy and the Indo-Pacific vision.

25th Foundation Day of BIMSTEC celebrated in Dhaka, Bangladesh - June 6th 2022

- ◆ 6th June 2022 also marks the celebration of the 25th foundation Day of BIMSTEC, Silver Jubilee Anniversary (25th anniversary) of the foundation of BIMSTEC.
- ◆ BIMSTEC, the sub-regional organization, came into being on 6th June 1997 through the Bangkok Declaration.

First ever India-EU security and defense consultations held in Brussels

The first ever India-European Union (EU) security and defense consultation was held in Brussels, Belgium. The consultations were held in accordance with the decision taken at the India-EU summit in July 2020. The consultations were co-chaired by Somnath Ghosh, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Defence, and Sandeep Chakraborty, Joint Secretary (Europe West), Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) of India and Director Security and Defense Policy of the European Union.

EU Recommends Candidate Status for Ukraine & Moldova

The European Commission has made a historic step in recommending that Ukraine and Moldova be granted European Union (EU) candidate status, paving the way for them to progress from former Soviet republics to developed economies in the world's largest trade bloc, the EU.

On June 17, 2022, European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen announced the recommendation.

Backdrop :

- ◆ The European Commission's unprecedented announcement is made in the wake of Russia's invasion of Ukraine on February 24, 2022, which killed many people and caused

India hosted 8th meeting of the Heads of the Border Services of SCO in New Delhi; 12th BRICS NSAs meet held virtually

On June 15-17,2022, India hosted the 8th meeting of the Heads of Border Services of the competent authorities of member states of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) in New Delhi, Delhi.

- ◆ India is represented by Border Security Force (BSF) Director General (DG) Pankaj Kumar Singh.
- ◆ This was one of several events being organised in 2022 by India as Chair of SCO's Regional Anti-Terrorist Structure (SCO-RATS) mechanism. India became the chair of SCO-RATS on October 28,2021 for a one-year period.
- ◆ India also hosted the counter-terror experts from the SCO countries in New Delhi on May 16,2022.

Key Highlights :

- ◆ The discussions were held on the pressing security challenges, including threats of terrorism, and regional security scenarios, including the situation in Afghanistan.
- ◆ The members also assessed the situation on the state borders of the SCO member states, trends and forecasts of its development.
- ◆ The plan for preparation and organisation of Joint Border Operation 2022 i.e.
- ◆ "Friendship Border - 2022" was also reviewed and approved.
- ◆ The members supported the initiative of the China to conduct the 9 th round of Joint

Border Operations of the border services of the competent authorities of the SCO member states i.e. "Solidarity - 2023" in \$2023 .\$.

- ◆ The proposals on the place, timing and work plan of the Group of Experts of the Border Services of the Competent Authorities of the SCO Member States for 2023 was also approved.

Delhi's IGI Airport Stands Best in India and South Asia, 37th among World's top 50

The 2022 Skytrax World Airport Awards named Delhi's Indira Gandhi International (IGI) airport the finest in India and South Asia for the 4th consecutive year at the ceremony conducted at Passenger Terminal EXPO in Paris on 16 th June 2022.

- ◆ The airport rose to 37th position from 45th position in 2021, and it is the only airport from India to be featured in the world's top 50 airports.
- ◆ Qatar's Hamad International Airport has been named the World's Best Airport for the 2nd year followed by Tokyo Haneda International Airport, Japan and Singapore Changi Airport.

Gustavo Petro Wins the Colombian Election, Becomes 1st Leftist President

Gustavo Petro, a former Mayor of capital Bogota and a longtime senator, who has transformed the social and economic system, becomes 1st leftist President, who will take office in August 2022.

- ◆ Francia Marquez, will be the country's first Afro-Colombian woman Vice President

About Gustavo Petro :

- ◆ Gustavo Petro has received more than 50 percent of the vote, with more than 99 percent counted. He will face issues related to Lack of opportunity and rising violence; high levels of deforestation in the Colombian Amazon; and growing threats to democracy.
- ◆ He has also pledged to fully implement a 2016 peace deal with FARC rebels and seek talks with the still-active ELN guerrillas.
- ◆ Petro had also been a part of a different rebel group, called the M-19, which demobilized in 1990 , and became a political party that helped rewrite the country's constitution.

China Launches its 1st fully Domestically Built Aircraft Carrier named Fujian



On June 17, 2022, China launched its first fully domestically built catapult aircraft carrier, 'Fujian' which is its most advanced naval vessel. It was launched at a brief ceremony held at Shanghai's Jiangnan Shipyard. It is the biggest and most modern aircraft carrier, marking a major military advance for the Asian superpower.

- ◆ Fujian is China's 3rd aircraft carrier built by China State Shipbuilding Corporation (CSSC) Limited.
- ◆ It has a flat, straight flight deck equipped with electromagnetic catapults and arresting devices, and has a full displacement of more than 80,000 tones.
- ◆ It is named after China's eastern coastal province of Fujian.
- ◆ The ship can carry 50 unmanned systems, including unmanned boats, drones and underwater vehicles.

Pakistan Stays on FATF 'Grey List' Subject to On-site Verification

June 2022 plenary session of the Financial Action Task Force (FATF) was held in Berlin, Germany. According to this session, Pakistan will continue to be on the 'Grey List' of countries under increased monitoring of the Financial Action Task Force (FATF), a french based international watchdog.

- ◆ Paris-based FATF added Pakistan in 2018 to the "grey list," which is composed of countries with a high risk of money laundering and terrorism financing but which have formally committed to working with the task force to make changes.
- ◆ FATF removed Malta from its "grey list" but added Gibraltar.

Indo-Nepal Bharat Pride Tourist Train



Recently the first India-Nepal Bharat Gaurav tourism train has been flagged off from Delhi's Safdarjung railway station. 500 Indian tourists are on board this train. This tourist train will connect India and Nepal for the first time.

The Bharat Gaurav Tourist Train between India and Nepal will provide an opportunity to people across the country to visit the country's architectural, historical and cultural sites.

The first journey of this train (Ramayana circuit) covers the religious destination of Janakpur (in Nepal) apart from other popular destinations like Ayodhya, Nandigram, Varanasi, Sitamarhi, Chitrakoot, Prayagraj, Hampi, Panchavati (Nashik), Rameshwaram and Bhadrachalam Will be done.

Bharat Gaurav Trains is an attempt to show the rich spiritual, cultural and historical heritage of India to its people. This unique idea was conceived by the Ministry of Railways. This concept will help in promoting tourism on a large scale across the country. It will also provide an opportunity to the people to explore the Indian culture. This train will return to Delhi after

completing 18 days journey. It will cover a distance of about 8000 km in the entire Ramayana tour.

Piyush Goyal inaugurates 'Mango Festival' in Belgium

On 17 June, Piyush Goyal, Union Minister of Commerce and Industry, has inaugurated a "Mango Festival" in Brussels, Belgium to raise awareness among Europeans and establish a market for Indian mangoes in Europe.

- ◆ India is a big supplier of mangoes to the rest of the globe, but most of the mangoes end up in the Middle East rather than Europe. This is the first time it has been hosted in Belgium.

Khuvsgul Lake National Park

Recently Khuvsgul Lake National Park of Mongolia has been included in the World Network of Biosphere Reserves by UNESCO. This decision was taken during the 34th session of the International Co-ordinating Council of Man and Biosphere Programme. This event is taking place in Paris, France. Khuvsgul Lake is located in the northern Mongolian province of Khuvsgul near the Russian border.

It is the source of 70% of Mongolia's fresh water and is situated at an altitude of about 1645 m above sea level which is 135 km long and 262 m deep lake. It is the second largest lake in Mongolia in terms of area and about 200 km from Lake Baikal in Russia. Located in the west.

South Korea launches first home-made space rocket

On June 21, South Korea launched its first home-made space rocket on a second attempt. This space rocket was launched months after the last lift-off, failing to place a payload into orbit.

The successful launch of the space rocket will boost South Korea's growing space ambitions. It has also proved that the country has critical technologies for manufacturing space-based surveillance systems as well as large missiles. Since the 1990s, South Korea has sent several satellites into space, but all were launched overseas using rockets built on foreign technology.

South Korea attempted to launch the satellite for the first time in October 2021. On the first attempt, the rocket's dummy payload reached the desired altitude of 700 km. However, it could not enter orbit as the rocket's third-stage engine burned out earlier than planned.

14th BRICS Summit 2022

The 14th BRICS summit will be held in virtual mode on June 23, 2022. Xi Jinping, Russian President Vladimir Putin, Prime Minister Narendra Modi, South African President Cyril Ramaphosa and Brazilian President Jair Bolsonaro will come together in this summit.

India's negotiators want to ensure that any joint statements made from this summit are neutral as well as limit any attempts by China and Russia to use the platform to spread propaganda against the US and its allies. To be.

The Indian side will also try to delay China's attempt to expand the BRICS grouping by

pushing the organization to bring in new members criteria.

- ◆ The BRICS grouping has become a forum for all developing countries to discuss and deliberate on issues of common concern. During this meeting, the Heads of State will discuss inter-BRICS cooperation in areas such as trade, terrorism, traditional medicine, health, environment, reform of multilateral institutions and combating the COVID-19 pandemic.
- ◆ Theme of BRICS Summit: BRICS Summit 2022 will be organized under the theme "Foster High-Quality BRICS Partnership, Usher in a New Era for Global Development".
- ◆ BRICS Summit: Brazil, Russia, India and China formed the BRIC bloc in 2009. South Africa joined this block in 2010, which was followed by the creation of the "BRICS Block".

EX KHAAN QUEST 2022

Multinational peace exercise "Ex Khan Quest-2022" concluded on June 20, 2022 at "Peace Support Operations Training Center" in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia. Ex Khan Quest 2022 was conducted from June 6 to June 20, 2022. It provided a platform for sharing best practices and mutual learning among armies of 16 nations. The Indian contingent was represented by the personnel of "Ladakh Scouts". He participated in field training and command post exercises.

Activities Organized During the Exercise: During this exercise, a number of training activities were conducted as part of the United Nations Brigade, conducting simulated tactical operations, training of staff and command appointments as

per the mandate of the United Nations (UN). As part of the nation brigade.

- ◆ **Ex Khan Quest** : It is a multinational peacekeeping operation exercise. The exercise includes the United Nations Peacekeeping Mission Command Post exercise, which is a United Nations Peacekeeping Mission field training exercise. It is designed to improve peacekeeping capabilities, enhance the core doctrine of the United Nations, and strengthen military-to-military ties of all participants.
- ◆ EX Khan Quest 2022 helped to increase the level of defense cooperation between the Indian Army and other participating countries, especially the Mongolian Armed Forces. It also helped enhance bilateral relations between India and Mongolia.

China's navy has the world's largest fleet- To build a naval facility in Cambodia

China is secretly building a naval facility on the northern portion of Cambodia's Ream Naval Base that would help extend its military's currently limited reach in foreign waters.

China commands the world's largest naval fleet with more than 350 vessels compared to the US Navy has 296 ships and submarines.

ii. China currently has only one foreign naval base at Djibouti in East Africa. The project in Cambodia would give China a foothold in Southeast Asia and a position in the western region of the South China Sea, part of china's ambition to grow its military influence worldwide.

Two African Nations Gabon & Togo Join the Commonwealth Group of Nations

The two African countries, Gabon and Togo, were admitted to the Commonwealth of Nations, as its 55th and 56th members, respectively, at the Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting (CHOGM) 2022, held in Kigali, the capital of Rwanda, from June 20 to June 25, 2022, under the new chairmanship of Rwandan President Paul Kagame.

- ◆ Gabon and Togo were historically French colonies which have never been British colonies.
- ◆ Rwanda was the last country to join the Commonwealth in 2009.
- ◆ Like Mozambique, a former Portuguese colony that joined the Commonwealth in 1995 and became the first member without historic links to Britain, Rwanda was never colonised by the British.

New Members Gabon and Togo :

- ◆ The formal Commonwealth membership procedure for Gabon, a Central African nation, began in 2017, while that for Togo, a West African nation, started in 2014.
- ◆ Gabon, is bordered by the Republic of Congo, Equatorial Guinea, and Cameroon, which is also a Commonwealth member. It has a thin population of 2 million.
- ◆ Togo is bordered by Ghana, a Commonwealth member as well as Benin and Burkina Faso. It has a population of approximately \$7.8\$ million people.

Khushi Patel from United Kingdom Wins Miss India Worldwide 2022

According to the New-York based India Festival Committee (IFC), Khushi Patel, a biomedical student from the United Kingdom (UK), has been declared the winner of the Miss India Worldwide 2022, the longest-running Indian pageant outside of India.

- ◆ This is the 29th edition of the pageant. The previous event (28th edition) was held in 2019.
- ◆ Vaidehi Dongre from the United States was declared the 1st runner up while Shrutika Mane became the 2nd runner up.
- ◆ The top 12 contestants at the pageant were the winners of various other contests globally.
- ◆ 2022's pageant was held after 3 years with the last one being organised at the Leela Hotel in Mumbai, Maharashtra in September 2019.

Mohammed Jalood became New President of the International Weightlifting Federation

The International Weightlifting Federation (IWF) has elected Mohammed Hasan Jalood from Iraq as its new president at the 2022 IWF Special and Electoral Congress in Tirana, Albania. He is also the first Asian who became president in International Weightlifting Federation. He succeeds out-going Interim President Dr. Michael Irani.

- ◆ Mohammed Jalood was a former weightlifter and also holds citizenship status in Kazakhstan and also a former general secretary of the Asian Weightlifting Federation.

NASA Launches First Rocket from Australian Commercial Spaceport In 27 Years

The National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA), the space agency of the United States (US), launched a NASA Black Brant IX suborbital sounding rocket from the Arnhem Space Center (ASC) on the Dhupuma Plateau near Nhulunbuy in Australia.

- ◆ It was the first occasion that NASA had launched a rocket from Northern Territory of Australia in 27 years, since 1995. It was also the agency's first launch from a commercial spaceport outside of the United States.
- ◆ Two of the three missions will focus on Alpha Centauri A and B and the nearest double-star systems to the Earth, at a distance of 4.3 light-years. The third will study X-rays emerging from the interstellar medium - the clouds of gases and particles in the space between stars.

Note :

- ◆ NASA launched rockets from the Royal Australian Air Force's Woomera range complex in South Australia in 1995.

World Allergy Week 2022

World Allergy Week 2022 is observed across the globe from 5th to 11th June 2022 to create awareness about allergic diseases and related disorders. World Allergy Week is an annual observance initiated by the World Allergy Organisation (WAO).

The initiative of WAO also aims to advocate for the provision of training and resources in the diagnosis, management, and prevention of these allergic diseases and asthma.

- ◆ World Allergy Week 2021 was observed from 13th to 19th June 2021
- ◆ World Allergy Week 2020 was observed from 28th June to 4th July 2020 .\$.
- ◆ The theme of World Allergy Week 2022 is "Breathe Better: The Asthma & Allergy Connections", which highlights that breathing better starts with understanding the connection between asthma and allergy.

A solid fueled rocket named "Juljana" was launched by Iran



Recently a solid fueled rocket named "Juljana" has been launched by Iran. The Juljana is a 25.5 meter tall Iranian Satellite Launch Vehicle. It is capable of carrying a payload of 220 kg or a satellite into an orbit located 500 km above the Earth. The satellite will provide a boost to Iran's space industry along with collecting data in low-Earth orbit. It is the first indigenously designed and indigenously built Hybrid Fuel Satellite Launch Vehicle. It is the third civilian satellite launch vehicle developed in Iran after Safir and Simorg. The Juljana rocket was unveiled on February 1, 2021. It was first launched into sub-orbital flight for telemetry and testing purposes on February 1, 2021. The rocket is named after the horse of Imam Hussain (grandson of Prophet Muhammad).

India Center established at Busan University of Foreign Studies, South Korea

The India Center has been established at Busan University of Foreign Studies, South Korea to promote activities related to India. This center will act as a major organization for India related programs in Busan. It will provide necessary resources for interested students in India and will emphasize on increasing academic and cultural cooperation with Busan University. An MoU was also signed on the occasion to promote cooperation in the field of education and cultural exchange between Busan University and the Swami Vivekananda Cultural Center in Seoul.

Announcement of Global Infrastructure Programs

Recently, global infrastructure programs worth 600 billion US dollars for poor countries have been announced by the G7 group. The move is aimed at boosting competition with China's Belt and Road Initiative. From the year 2022 to the year 2027, the US government and its allies will try to touch the figure of 600 billion US dollars.

The Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) is formally known as the One Belt One Road Initiative. It is a global infrastructure development strategy, which was launched by China in the year 2013. Under this, China planned to invest in about 70 countries and international organizations. The project is the centerpiece of Chinese President Xi Jinping's foreign policy. BRI has been signed by 146 countries till March 2022.

India and UK launch Commonwealth Diplomatic Academy program

External Affairs Minister of India S. Jaishankar and his UK counterpart Liz Truss have announced plans to launch a joint "India-UK Commonwealth Diplomatic Academy programme". The plan was announced after their meeting in Rwanda. The India-UK Commonwealth Diplomatic Academy program will be launched to train young and aspiring diplomats from both countries. According to the IFC, Navya Pengol of America was the "first runner-up", while Suriname's Chiquita Malaha was the "second runner-up". IFC has been organizing this competition for the last 29 years. This year's beauty pageant was held after a gap of three

years, with the last being held in September 2019 at The Leela Hotel in Mumbai.

Researchers discover a new enterprise-grade Android spyware called 'Hermit'

Lookout, a cloud-based security company, recently discovered a new spyware called "Hermit". Hermit spyware is capable of affecting Android and iOS devices. As TechCrunch reports, security researchers at Lookout have reported that national governments in Kazakhstan and Italy have used the Android version of Hermit spyware in "targeted attacks".

Hermit is a commercial spyware and has been used by governments in northern Syria, Kazakhstan and Italy. It was first detected in Kazakhstan in April 2022, when the government violently suppressed protests against its policies. It was also used for anti-corruption investigations in the north-eastern Kurdish region of Syria and by Italian authorities.

Hermit Android App is distributed via text message. The message seems to be coming from a legitimate source. Malware can impersonate telecommunications companies and other apps developed by manufacturers such as Oppo and Samsung.

The Hermit Android malware is modular because it allows spyware to download additional components that are required for the malware to run. Like other spyware, Hermit malware also uses various modules to record audio as well as collect call logs, messages, photos, emails.

It can redirect phone calls and reveal the exact location of the device.



Formula One: Max Verstappen wins Azerbaijan GP to Become Red Bull's Most Successful Driver



On 12th June 2022 Red Bull's Max Verstappen (Belgium) won the Azerbaijan Formula One Grand Prix 2022 held at Baku, Azerbaijan to extend his Formula One (F1) championship lead over Ferrari's Charles Leclerc (Monaco).

Verstappen's 25th career win ties him with Jim Clark and Niki Lauda for ninth on the all-time list.

- ◆ Formula One championships are held by Federation Internationale de l'Automobile (FIA)

Kishore Rahul Srivastava becomes India's 74th Grandmaster

Rahul Srivastava P of Telangana has become the 74th Grandmaster of India to clinch the title by breaking the barrier of 2500 (Elo points)

Neeraj Chopra sets national record in javelin throw at Pavo Nurmi Games in Finland

India's Neeraj Chopra, who won the Tokyo Olympics gold medal at the Pavo Normi

Games in Finland, created a national record in the javelin throw with a distance of 89.3-zero meters. Chopra's earlier national record was 88.07m which he had set in March last year in Patiala. He won the Tokyo Olympic gold medal on August 7, 2021 with a throw of 87.58m. Neeraj Chopra is India's first Olympic gold medalist in athletics and only the second individual gold medalist at the Olympics.

US, Canada, & Mexico to Host FIFA World Cup 2026; 1st time to be Hosted by 3 Countries

Federation Internationale de Football Association (FIFA -International Federation of Association Football) announced that the FIFA World Cup 2026 will be jointly hosted by the United States (US), Canada, and Mexico. For the first time in the history of FIFA World Cup the event will be hosted by 3 countries. FIFA has selected 16 cities from these countries through a bid.

- ◆ Los Angeles (US), Toronto (Canada) and Mexico City (Mexico) are among the host cities for the tournament.
- ◆ This will be the first World Cup hosted by more than one nation since 2002. Japan and South Korea jointly hosted the 2002 World Cup.

Indian Football Captain Sunil Chhetri becomes 5th Highest Goalscorer; Equals Ferenc Puskás

Indian Men's football team captain Sunil Chhetri scored his 84th International goal against Hong Kong during the Asian Football Confederation (AFC) Asian Cup 2023 Qualifiers.

He has equalled the record of Real Madrid and Hungarian Football Legend Ferenc Puskás and became the joint fifth highest goalscorer in international football.

Sunil Chhetri scored 84 goals in 129 appearances while Ferenc Puskás (who died in 2006 aged 79) scored 84 goals in 85 international matches.

- ◆ Sunil Chhetri is the 3rd highest goal scorer in international football among active players, after Cristiano Ronaldo with 117 goals and Lionel Messi with 86 goals.
- ◆ He is also the highest active goal scorer from Asia and India.

Formula 1: Max Verstappen wins Canadian Grand Prix 2022

2021 Formula One World Champion and a red bull racer, Max Verstappen of the Netherlands has won his 6th Formula One (F1) Canadian Grand Prix 2022 at Circuit Gilles Villeneuve in Montreal, Canada. Verstappen has won four of the previous five Grand Prix this season.

- ◆ This is Verstappen's 1st Canadian victory in his 150th career start, his 6th in 2022 and the 26th of his career.
- ◆ Carlos Sainz of Spain, Ferrari driver placed 2nd and Lewis Hamilton of United Kingdom, Mercedes driver placed 3rd in the season.

Rahul Srivastav Becomes India's 74th Grandmaster

The 19-year-old Rahul Srivastav P of Telangana has become India's 74th

Grandmaster (GM) after breaking the 2500 (Elo points) barrier in live International Chess Federation (FIDE) ratings during the 9th Cattolica Chess Festival 2022 in Italy.

Achievements:

- ◆ Rahul Srivatshav reached the 2500 Elo live rating mark after drawing his 8 th round game against Grandmaster Levan Pantsulaia in the Cattolica event. ii. He had already secured 5 GM norms and achieved the title when he crossed the rating threshold of 2500 .
- ◆ To become a GM, a player must secure 3 GM norms and cross the live rating of 2500 Elo points.

India's Anahat Singh wins Asian Junior Squash title in U-15 category

Indian player Anahat Singh, 14-year-old, won the gold medal in the girls Under15 category at the 29th Asian Junior Squash Individual Championships defeating Kwong Ena of Hong Kong 3-0 in the final. The tournament was held in Pattaya, Thailand between 15 - 19 June 2022 .

Anahat reached the finals without dropping a single game in the tournament and had also defeated Malaysian top seed Whitney Isabelle Wilson 3-0 in the semifinals.

So far, Anahat has won 46 national circuit titles, two national championships and eight international titles. She is the only Indian girl to win the US Junior Open in any category and the British Junior Open.



June 17: World Day for Desertification and Drought Prevention



The primary objective of organizing this day is to encourage sports among the common people and to spread the message of making sports an integral part of life.

- ◆ It is to be known that the beginning of the modern Olympic Games is inspired by the ancient Olympic Games held in Olympia (Greece) from 8th century BC to 4th century AD. It was held in Olympia, Greece in honor of Zeus (the supreme god of Greek religion).
- ◆ Baron Pierre de Coubertin established the International Olympic Committee (IOC) in the year 1894 and laid the foundation for the Olympic Games. It is a non-profit independent international organization committed to building a better world through sport. It ensures the regular holding of the Olympic Games, supports all affiliated member organizations and promotes the values of the Olympics in appropriate ways.
- ◆ The idea of organizing International Olympic Day was presented at the meeting of the International Olympic Committee in the year 1947 and in the year 1948 this proposal was given official approval.

World Hydrography Day 2022- June 21

World Hydrography Day is annually celebrated across the globe on 21 st June to create awareness about Hydrography and its importance in improving knowledge of the seas and oceans.

- ◆ The theme for World Hydrography Day 2022 is "Hydrography - contributing to the United Nations Ocean Decade".

23 June: United Nations Public Service Day

United Nations Public Service Day is organized by the United Nations every year on 23 June as a token of respect and gratitude towards civil services around the world. This day recognizes the work of public servants, emphasizes their contribution in the development of the society and motivates the youth to make a career in the public sector. On 20 December 2002, the United Nations General Assembly declared 23 June as the United Nations Public Service Day. In order to increase awareness about this day and the importance of public service, the United Nations had started the 'United Nations Public Service Awards' (UNPSA) program in the year 2003, which was awarded in the year 2016 according to the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. was updated.

The 'United Nations Public Service Awards' program promotes and rewards innovation and quality in public services by recognizing innovative achievements and services of public institutions, which are more efficient and favorable in countries around the world in favor of sustainable development. Contributing to public administration.

Day of the Seafarer 2022

The United Nations(UN)'s Day of the Seafarer is annually observed across the globe on 25th June to create awareness about the seafarers and the challenges they face. The day also offers a platform to pay tribute to the seafarers recognising the risk they take in the execution of their daily life and their duties in the hostile environment.

- ◆ 25th June 2022 marks the observance of the 12th Day of the Seafarer.
- ◆ The observance of the Day of the Seafarer is led by the International Maritime Organization (IMO).
- ◆ The theme/Campaign theme of Day of the Seafarer 2022 is "Your voyage then and now, share your journey".

World Vitiligo Day June 2022

World Vitiligo Day(WVD) is annually observed across the globe on 25 th June to create awareness about vitiligo, a long-term skin condition caused due to lack of melanin. The day also aims to include recognition of bullying, social neglect, psychological trauma and disability of the people affected by vitiligo. 25th June 2022 marks the observance of the 12th annual World Vitiligo Day.

- ◆ Every year WVD is hosted by a different city and the global campaign headquarters of 2022 WVD is hosted by Mexico under the presidency of Prof. Jorge Ocampo Candiani MD, Chair of the Dermatology Department at Hospital Universitario De Nuevo Leon - WVD 2022 President.
- ◆ The International theme for World Vitiligo Day 2022 is 'Learning To Live With Vitiligo'.

30 June : International Asteroid Day

International Asteroid Day is organized every year on 30 June as a United Nations recognized campaign to raise awareness about asteroids, the potential hazards they cause and the scientific mysteries known from their study. Also, this day inspires the general public to know about asteroids. This year's 'International Asteroid Day' marks the 113th anniversary of the

largest 'asteroid event' that occurred near the Tunguska River in Siberia.

In December 2016, the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) adopted a resolution to organize 30 June every year as 'International Asteroid Day', with the aim of commemorating the 'Tunguska event' in Siberia annually.

Be aware that asteroids are small rocky materials that orbit the Sun. Asteroids revolve around the Sun in the same way as the planets, but their size is much smaller than the planets. They are also called minor planets. According to NASA, the number of known asteroids is about 10,97,106, which were formed during the formation of the solar system 4.6 billion years ago.

30 June : International Parliamentary Day

International Parliamentary Day is observed globally on 30 June every year. This day is celebrated to mark the processes of Parliament by which parliamentary systems of government improve the everyday lives of people around the world. At the same time, it is also an opportunity for the Parliament/MPs to discuss among themselves to face the challenges and deal with them effectively.

This day was started in the year 2018 by the resolution of the United Nations General Assembly. Apart from this, the day also marks the date of the formation of the Inter-Parliamentary Union, a global organization of parliaments, which was established in the year 1889.

Inter-Parliamentary Union encourages coordination and exchange of experiences between parliaments and parliamentarians of all countries.

It contributes to the protection and promotion of human rights as well as to the strengthening and development of representative institutions.
